


# "Youth in search of identity, what antidote against radicalization?"

### Possible Causes of Radicalization in second and third generation Muslims issued from immigration aged 15-25:

- Identity issues =>search of identity due to the clash between the religious values of Muslim culture and secular values of Western countries
- Religious illiteracy
- Single-parent family background= need to belong to a « wholesome »family
- Need to belong to a community which shares the same values
- Search for a meaning and scope in life
- Lack of self-esteem
- Wish to become a hero/famous (even if anti-hero), to feel valued
- Anger due to discrimination=>need to justify the release of their inner violence







### IDENTITY OF RUPTURE

- « An identity of rupture is the process whereby an individual adopts an identity shaped by [...] values and norms she/he considers as being above a democratic, republican, French and/or Western identity.
- In such an identity, Muslim identity takes a predominant and then unidemensional place, the other identity facets of the person having been rejected. [...]
- [P]aradoxically, the individuals who adopt an identity of rupture, often do not know Islam. [...] (Amélie Boukhobza, « L'identitarisme de rupture est une des clés de la radicalisation islamiste», Opinion Internationale, 3 February 2017).



- ⇒Feeling of superiority in terms of values
- ⇒Communitarianism
- ⇒radicalisation
- ⇒Tendency to feel "humiliated", "victimised", belonging to a group of people which are aggressed
- => can transform a young person in search of identity into « an ennemy of this society in the name of the "religion of the oppressed». (See Fahrad Krosrokhavar, *Radicalisation* (Éd. de la Maison des Sciences de l'Homme: 2014, pp. 26-27).

- Forum Theatre, or the « theatre of the oppressed »
- =>conceived by Augusto Boal in Brazil, and then in France during his exile in Europe (1979).

- Based on the idea that theatre can change the world
- The joker, or stage director, plays a fundamental role:
- facilitates the debate with the public and coordinates the interventions of the Spect\_Actors on the stage
- He/she leads the public to « dig deeper », by encouraging them to express themselves, develop their point of view and contribute to finding alternatives
